The United States Probation Office for the District of South Carolina is seeking quotes for shred services for fiscal year 2023.

The U.S. Probation Office has five divisional offices which require shred services on rotating schedules ranging from 8 to 12 weeks. The period of performance for this solicitation commences on October 1, 2022, and ends on September 30, 2023.

All work shall be completed Monday – Friday (exclusive of federal holidays). Detailed specifications to include locations, schedules, points of contacts, and pickup hours are listed on the Quote Sheet on Page 3.

Quotes should include the price for all containers at each location as well as a price for excess shred items outside of the container.

Quotes should include any fees and/or surcharges for, to include but not limited to, scheduled pickup cancellations, schedule changes and/or any additional pickups scheduled throughout the year.

Invoices are to be submitted after each service and will be processed under Net 30 terms.
