An open market, fixed-price award from this RFQ may be made based on the lowest priced, technically acceptable offer (meets all specified requirements and other applicable considerations). This request does not commit the government to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of the submission of your offer or to contract for supplies or service should none of the vendors meet the necessary specifications.

Please submit a cover letter with your proposal utilizing your company's letterhead and the completed Provision B-5 under terms and conditions (attached). Your proposal and any questions regarding this RFQ should be addressed as follows. *NOTE: Only questions in written/email form will be accepted, no questions will be accepted via telephone.*

The <u>deadline</u> for submission of proposals is **5:00 PM Friday**, **September 22**, **2023**. Mailed, hand-carries or emailed quotes will be accepted and must be received by the date and times listed above. *If you decide not to submit a proposal*, *kindly submit a "no offer" response*. An award, if issued, will be based on the lowest-priced, technically acceptable offer and will be contingent upon available funding as of September 7, 2023. You will be notified via email once an award is made.

REQUEST FOR QUOTATION

The United States Probation Office for the District of South Carolina is conducting a solicitation for a climate-controlled storage facility for our Headquarters Office which is 4,800 square feet. Our office consists of a lobby, kitchen, conference room, breakroom, workroom, large file room and seven offices. Items to be stored include appliances, furniture, and boxes.

STATEMENT OF WORK

The facility should have security gates or doors, good lighting and be well maintained to prevent damages to items stored. Video monitoring surveillance is preferred. Vendor should detail overall safety and security of the facility.

The storage unit must be climate controlled to prevent humidity issues and/or damage to items being stored.

Vendor should detail unit(s) size and type. The unit(s) must have drive-up access.

Vendor should detail the amount of the rent and the due date. The estimated length of the lease is six months to one year; The lease may be renewed up to three years upon written notification by the U.S. Probation Office.

Vendor should detail all fees associated with the lease.

Vendor should detail tenant rights and responsibilities.

Vendor should detail landlord rights and responsibilities.

Vendor should detail cancellation terms.

Vendor should detail move-out process (i.e., when to give notice and what condition to leave the unit in).

BASIS OF AWARD

Offers are evaluated based on price. Award may be made to the lowest-priced offer for quote which meets the technical requirements outlined in this RFQ. This RFQ does not commit the government to pay any costs incurred in the preparation of the submission of your offer or to contract for supplies or service should none of the vendors meet the necessary specifications. The awarded vendor will be required to register with sam.gov or complete and submit Form AO213 within three days after notice of intent to award and prior to the issuance of a purchase order.

TAXES

INVOICES

Invoices are to be submitted monthly. All invoices will be processed under Net 30 terms unless otherwise specified.
